Shaniko & Transportation (part 1)

Excerpt from Shaniko Remembered by Robert Altermatt

"When the Columbia Southern Railroad arrived at Shaniko, transportation and communication requirements exploded.

Farm products moved to the rail head, merchandise arrived for all Eastern Oregon. Passengers arrived and continued to their ultimate destination. U.S. Mail and Western Union telegrams were routed through Shaniko.

Grain and wool arrived at the rail head for shipping to The Dalles, Portland and beyond. Incoming trains brought barbed wire, canned vegetables, fence posts, pipe, and lumber for the outlying land.

And the outlying land was large: Bend, Fossil, Prineville, Antelope, Ashwood, Mitchell, a 10,000 square mile area received supplies funneled through Shaniko."
